Committee Officer Reports - 2019

President

Growth

Another year of membership growth continues to create a vibrant paddling community at Arawa. A resurgence in the Coast to Coast and continued success in sprint disciplines sees Arawa in a strong position with continued optimism for the future of our sport and recreational activities.

Capacity

With the growth we have seen, there is a recognition that we are bursting at the seams in terms of capacity to cater to the needs of members. Coaching, fleet management and storage are aspects of the club's activities that present challenges in consistently meeting member expectations.

Planning

Members of the committee have invested a significant amount of time and energy over the last couple of years into following and contributing to the Regenerate Canterbury process to develop the plan for the Otakaro Avon Corridor. While the hope was to influence the outcome with a view to improving the waterways available to members, it's fair to say that the process has been frustrating and there are few indications that there will be any significant improvement in the availability or quality of waterways in the near short to medium term. As a result, research has begun on options to improve the club's facilities both in terms of quality and quantity to better cater to membership needs.

Future

The next 12 months are expected to feature increased expenditure on equipment and storage, identifying strategies for coping with growth and putting a plan in place to enhance the club environment. This is an exciting time for the club and we welcome the input of all members in contributing to the Arawa community. Please contact any of the committee if you are able to help out in any way in the coming year.

Treasurer

The club has had another successful financial year as can be seen from the attached statement.

Total revenue was up \$12,000 from last to \$214,754 while expenses were up by \$3,000 to \$115,833. This gives an operating profit of \$98,254 and a net profit of \$81,245 after depreciation was deducted. This is approximately \$10,000 higher than last year.

Our rebuilding fund (the term deposit of \$776,000) continues to grow but there is some concern re the continually escalating building cost and absolutely no progress by the authorities re what is happening at Kerr's Reach.

The club is very lucky with the generous support and help from members, sponsors, benefactors and dedicated committee members who all combine together to contribute and build the club's strength.

Thanks to both Michelle and to Bruce for their assistance. A special thank you to Bruce for his help in meeting the increasingly arduous requirements of the charity commission.

Lastly once again a special thanks to Craig Cox for his role as honorary club auditor.

Coaching

During the last 12 months a small number of volunteer coaches made a huge contribution to the club in time and expertise. We have only to look at the results being achieved by our club members domestically, and also the numbers of paddlers gaining international selection, to see the high standard of coaching we have at the club, and the impact of the clubs coaching programs on the quality of paddlers coming out of Arawa at this time. The membership are very lucky in this regard.

Recent growth at the club has meant that the coaching infrastructure developed in recent years is being stretched to capacity, and the same people are continually being pressed to give more and more of themselves for nothing in return. If we are to continue to grow in numbers (though that is possibly another point that needs to be opened up for discussion), we really need other members to step up and back themselves as potential future coaches. Without additional support the sustainability of the current level of delivery is highly questionable.

A big thank you to everyone who has contributed their time indirectly or directly to the clubs coaching programs this year. We couldn't do it without you. For those who are now thinking about coaching, but not sure... get in touch with Paul and have a chat, we are happy to train you.

Paddling Events

Kayak Krazy 10km Series came to Christchurch - Sunday 17 June 2018

It was great to see everybody get involved and give their best efforts at the first Arawa Canoe Club Kayak Krazy 10km Series. We had a variety of crafts entered including a waka crew, gosh they put up a fantastic wake as they launched into their start.

Junior Sprint World Champs – 26-29 July 2018

Arawa had three athletes Dylan Neal-Hill, Pieta Lüthi and Olivia Brett travel overseas to France and Bulgaria for World Champs last July. Olivia Brett in first year of U18 age group managed to secure an A Final in K1 200m (placing 9th in the World) and comfortably finish first in the B Final in K2 500 with team mate Alicia Hoskin, after narrowly missing out on A Final spot by a few hundredths of a second.

World Canoe Sprint Champs

Most exciting news in August was obviously the and our longstanding athlete, Scott Martlew performing alongside the Women's programme and adding a silver medal tally for the event. This was celebrated through social media platforms and received well through the membership.

South Islands Championships - October 2018

It was good to get the first Regatta out of the way to see how the training fared over the winter months. Great having some of the senior paddlers come down Zac, Drabble, Veggie and Adam, maybe more can join us next year! The racing was tough, with a full programme on the Saturday. It was a great day, there were winners in all age groups from our club and a few losers who chose to seek cooling off in the blue lake, not mentioning any names at all... It kept the rescue boats busy... and out of trouble.

Arawa won the Sprint Challenge Trophy again with Mana second and Otago third.

Rasdex Prologue Series

The October/November events 2018 were covered by participants this year. Thanks to Charles Nimmo for his write-ups for e-News.

Blue Lakes 2 – December 2018

There were some truly outstanding performances from individuals and team boats over the course of the weekend, but as an example of what excellence of process can achieve, it was hard to go past our U18 women who took out their category in its entirety over both distances of 200m and 500m, finishing 1st, 2nd, and 3rd, in K1 and K2, and also winning the K4.

Rasdex Classic River Race – December 2018

The largest field in years lined up for a fantastic event, supported by paddlers from around NZ and as far afield as the UK and Australia.

Matthewes Cup – December 2018

Twenty six paddlers took to the water for the annual event round Quail Island. The course ran from Corsair Bay and competitors enjoyed BBQ afterwards. Congratulations to Tim Grammar who got to raise the trophy for the fastest time with handicap.

Lake Brunner Camp – January 2019

Juniors organised their first ever Summer Kayak Camp at Moana for the weekend. Up to forty clubbies made the trip over the pass to the shores of Lake Brunner for paddle sessions, team building tasks and a few hours of fun on the speedboats. This was planned and run by the athletes.

Waka Ama Sprint Champs – January 2019

Congratulations to Scott Martlew who won double gold in National Waka Ama Sprint Championships! Scott took the 200m and 500m titles with a commanding lead over the competition. Scott will not only

be aiming for Olympic qualification in ParaCanoe K1 for Tokyo Olympics 2020, but also adding a mix of training for qualification in Waka Ama racing too.

South Eyre Sprints – January 2019
